t is very interesting to report that Inspire Louisiana is back in print, publishing faith-based news and encouraging spiritually edifying articles. It is our prayer and intent that you will find printed copies of Inspire Louisiana around the Baton Rouge area as you did back in 2015. Our online publishing is in PDF format, so you can download what we post on our InspireLouisiana.com website for your reading pleasure and encouragement.

We suspect of the "Powers that Be" – local, state and national – that once they discover we are the same core group which in 2015 were evangelizing the Word of God, and promoting the Great Commandment of Christ: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, soul, mind, and strength; and your neighbor as yourself;" they'll seek to put us out of business again! If that be the case, so be it; however, we believe the power of God is stronger than all that may muster against us.

Back in 2015, when we initially began publishing Inspire Louisiana, our company was a not-for-profit 501-C3 corporation. Such corporations are within the purview of the Internal Revenue Service; and in the year 2016 our "non-profit" status was revoked when it was determined that the better part of our mission was spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ and encouraging spiritual renewal.

You will recall, the devastating Flood of August 2016 was a near-death knell for the economy of South Louisiana. Rather than adopting a commercial advertising base for financially supporting the publication of InspireLouisiana, we decided not to solicit advertising from financially-strapped businesses that survived the flood.

Much has transpired since Inspire Louisiana ceased publishing in 2016, and the changes over the past six years have NOT been all good, nor fruitful, for Baton Rouge. Violent crime, and all crimes in general, has skyrocketed – particularly murder. The murder rate in the middle years of the last decade averaged sixty homicides per year. Now the Baton Rouge murder rate has topped 140 in 2021 alone – the highest in the city' history.

Statistics indicate that upward of five percent of the population of EBR parish, and city of Baton Rouge are what the Chief of Police and other local officials have termed "bad actors" (i.e., criminal miscreants). In raw numbers that equals nearly 20,000 "bad actors" who are assumed to be armed and dangerous. For military-minded Folk, we know that 20,000 people is the size of two Divisions of soldiers. So, we have potentially two Army-size Divisions of "badactors" in our area to deal with.

Just considering, for a moment, the violent crime and murder rate in the area, we know there is a humongous dis-connect between what is happening on the streets and what SHOULD BE occurring based on the teachings of Jesus Christ. And it is worth noting that Baton Rouge is a city where there is an established church congregation or house of religious devotion on practically every street corner! It begs the question: Just what is being taught and preached, what role models and exemplary behavior patterns are being set forth in many of these churches?

Our core group made little to no deliberate nor concerted first effort to relaunch Inspire Louisiana. Various critical and even unexpected factors simply assembled into place and presented themselves in short order. It is as though we were suddenly offered the prime opportunity to start a Christian Faith-based publication. So we stood tall and said: "Here we are, Lord; send us to the front lines."

So by the Grace and Mercy of God, we at Inspire Louisiana stand ready to tackle and accomplish that which we are led to do by our great God: to help reclaim Baton Rouge and surrounding area from the clutches of His demonic Adversaries.

ere else can we be but ON OUR KNEES LORD in times like these in the Baton Rouge Metro area? An old fashion Christian Hymnal reads like this: "Where can we go but to the Lord?" Another old song from the 1950's with great prophetic words comes to mind: "No matter how hard I struggle and strive, I can't get out of this life alive." We will examine later the meanings of each of these song titles plus the implications of On Our Knees Lord in this discourse but first for some statistics.

Baton Rouge has one of the highest per capital murder rate in our nation of lawlessness and violence. It is a misnomer to even use the words LAW and ORDER to describe any part of the violence that is sweeping our area. It is physically dangerous for anyone, even law enforcement people to live in the environment of violence that is so pronounced in our midst. Baton Rouge Pastor Dr. Tommy French celebrates his 92nd birthday with a rare interview

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ost Pastors don't fade away or retire but merely begin blessing those around them with precious memories of those who have gone on before us to Glory-land. And so it was with Brother French when he sat down with me on his 92 birthday to discuss something that he was part of about fifty years ago that is still going strong today.

Dr. French, a young energetic Texas lad who came to Baton Rouge almost by happenstance it would seem except that Brother French, although young to the Mission field he knew at that time knew that God was guiding his footsteps. Brother French and his wife Mary were attending a church service Fairfield Baptist Church in Baton Rouge while visiting his parents on the night that Pastor Fletcher Hart announced that Fairfield Baptist was going to sponsor a "Mission Church" located on Lanier Drive to be appropriately named Lanier Baptist Church.

"When Pastor Hart announced that Fairfield Baptist Church was going to sponsor a "Mission Church" on Lanier Street in North Baton Rouge, I thought to myself, now that is something exciting that I would like to do," Pastor French recalled that night some 65 years ago. "Little did I know that I would soon be selected by Pastor Palmer at First Baptist Baton Rouge to develop a church on property they owned way out in the edge of town on Jefferson Highway."

"When you have church services on Sunday and Wednesday night and do all the other things that a "Mission Pastor" does in between services, time passes so fast," Pastor French acknowledged about his beginning days at what became known as Jefferson Baptist Church. "And then, to top all that activity, I met a real Jena Giant who played such a vital role in my ministry here at Jefferson Baptist."

"T. W. Terral was from Jena, Louisiana by the way of being a pastor in Pineville. He was directed to Lanier Baptist Church by our Higher Power where he served for 28 years. Not only did Brother Terral become my "unpaid assistant" here at Jefferson Baptist but he led the charge to guarantee when Cablevision first brought cable TV to Baton Rouge, that our faith based community had a channel reserved for broadcasting our church services forever as long as the Cable Charter was in operation."

"Brother Terral was the epitome of what you would desire in a Pastor," Brother French stated. "He was faith based to the Nth degree and well versed in scripture and as tenacious as what he used to refer to as a "Piney Woods Rooter" woods hog. Every so often, the Cable Channel wanted to eliminate what they referred to as the "Religious Channel" to replace it with more fantasy from Hollywood."

"So, Brother Terral and some of us would go down and meet with the powers that were and pointed out that the Charter Cablevision first had and now Cox has to provide cable TV service to Baton Rouge, guaranteed that the faithbased community would have at least one Religious Channel," Dr. French pointed out. "It was not easy for us to keep a channel for worship services going. It took a bulldog attitude type man like TW Terral to keep it going."

"Our Christian faith is being tested like at no other time in my lifetime. There are so many distractions to keep people from not only attending church services but serving in the Churches which is so very important in building a church and maintaining a church. To compete for the time of our younger generations is the key to the future of our churches as we know them today. It seems that the only time most people want to acknowledge

God is when a death occurs to someone close to them and so often it is even then only a fleeting focus of the spiritual aspects of life."


"Could we now in today's society and culture go out to the edge of Baton Rouge or any other city and start a church from scratch like we did here at Jefferson Baptist 64 years ago?" Dr. French questioned. "That is a very good question and the answer would be that it would be next to humanly impossible except all things are possible with our mighty God."

"My commitment to the Gospel of Jesus Christ actually started in 1948 when I heard a sermon on the radio delivered by Billy Graham on the steps of our national Capitol in Washington, D.C.," Dr. French recalled with clarity. "I told my wife, Mary, we're going to quit our jobs and enroll at Baylor University in Waco, Texas and then go to Seminary which we did at Southwest Theological Seminary in Fort Worth."

"I worked almost full-time at a trucking company in Waco while we were going to Baylor," Dr. French related. "I also worked in the Trucking Industry while I was attending Southwest Seminary which served me well because when I first came to Baton Rouge to visit my Mom and Dad, I found a job with a local trucking company because of my years of experience in moving freight while attending school."

"When I was selected to become the Mission Minister for the too-be Jefferson Baptist, I was still working full time for the trucking company here in Baton Rouge," Dr. French recalled those exciting days back in the 1950's. "That was what made it such a difficult decision to turn down the Greenwell Springs Baptist pastor's position because it paid a good salary and I would have been able to quit my trucking company job and focused entirely on Ministry."

"But it all turned out well because I could feel



the hand of the Lord leading me to do the Mission Church work," Dr. French explained. "It seemed that each time we needed something or somebody to fill a slot in the Mission Church work, someone would always turn up to fill that need."

"It was in November of 1963 that Brother TW Terral was brought into my life," Dr. French recalled. "What a difference that Man of God made in my life and in the faith community of Baton Rouge. His contributions were and are still immeasurable to Kingdom work here in Baton Rouge."

"In November of 2008, I had the revelation that it was time for me to consider finding a replacement, so I told the Church leaders here at Jefferson and they formed a search committee for a new pastor," Dr. French explained. "That is how we find Dr. Goza, another Texas boy. Its hard to believe now that its been fourteen years ago that we made the change."

"My wife, Mary, passed away and after a considerable time, I remarried to a very Godly woman, Sue, who had been attending church here at Jefferson Baptist for 45 years," Dr. French said in elaborating on his post-retirement life. "I still teach my Sunday school classes which I've been doing for 64 years. I stay very busy for a guy who is celebrating his 92nd birthday today on August 10."

"Sadly to say, but within the last few years, I preached the Celebration of Life Service for both TW and his wife here at Jefferson. It seems that TW and I are still attached because his son-in-law, Dr. Jeffery Burnam is my doctor and has helped me through some heart issues."

"But above all else, I have been highly blessed and favored since I decided to follow Jesus and submit my life to the Gospel and Kingdom work," Dr. French said in conclusion.

Intimacy And Marriage: How To Engage Your Wife's (Even Strong) Emotions by Walter Hackney

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arely does a book challenge the prevailing paradigm and succeed. In much the same vein as the child who said out loud that the emperor has no clothes or that Galileo (and others) did not believe that the earth was the center of the universe, Hackney objects to the practices that most men and women use to have a successful marital relationship (as well as presenting a viable alternative)!

Many people seem to fall in love and then often later fall out of love. Almost everyone has either personally experienced a divorce or had a friend or family member go through the tragedy of a divorce (this could also include a couple who live together, have at least one child, and then part ways). This book centers on one skill (and a host of supporting skills) as key in not only avoiding a divorce but being a foundation for a long and mutually satisfying relationship between a man and a woman.

The author makes several assumptions:

- The great majority of men are clueless about how most women are in high pain as well as how to appropriately connect with a woman and her, especially painful, emotions.
- Most women are willing to settle, at least initially, for a man who does not connect with them deeply .(like Charlotte Lucas in *Pride and Prejudice*).
- Males are often the cause of a woman's pain, and therefore a man should be involved in the process of easing or even taking away that pain.
- Men can best learn marital skills by practicing them in the midst of an safe intentional men's group and then transferring them in their marriage.
- Women can be in same gender groups and work on skills, such as clearly communicating with a man about how they would like to be treated.
- The great majority of marriages can be resurrected.

Buying and reading this book can be more effective (and much less costly!) than a divorce or years of marital counseling.

The target audience for Intimacy and Marriage certainly includes men and women who are in a troubled or distressed marriage; this book may be used as a last resort before divorce. However, this book could be useful to those individuals who are single, between relationships, in premarital counseling, presently in an amicable marriage, about to experience an empty nest, or are already divorced.

While many Christian and Jewish readers will be fairly familiar with many of the Bible stories, most will have their interest piqued at the particular lens that Hackney uses. Some of the real heroes of the faith, for example Abraham, Jacob, and David, fall short of the mark of engaging their wives' strong emotions. (Pastors could this material for a sermon – or even a series – and Sunday school classes or other small groups could study these stories one by one.) Even those outside those religious traditions may ponder deeply some of these lesser known or odd stories such as Huldah and Tamar. I would not be surprised if female readers cry, laugh, or get angry as they read this book or if male readers will be initially confused and have to read certain sections more than once. Almost all will come away with a different take on the Bible and relations between the sexes.

The contents of I&M include:

- 2. Biblical stories of women in pain in relation with at least one clueless male
- 3. The reality of the pain women experience
- 4. The author's failures, especially early in his marriage
- 5. A "typical" marriage
- 6. A definition of intimacy
- 7. Same-gender small group safety
- 8. Harmful relational habits men can avoid
- 9. Strategies women can use to get well
- 10. How a man can receive his wife's emotions
- 11. How a man can enter his wife's emotions
- 12. How a man can engage his wife's emotions
- 13. Biblical stories of men who were able to receive, enter, and even engage a woman's emotions
- 14. The author's gaining of skills in regards to engaging a woman's strong emotions
- 15. An atypical (much better!) marriage



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(The book does not have to be read from front to back. The reader is free to read first any parts of the book that are intriguing. Later, one may be interested in reading the other sections that fill in the gaps.)

In addition, two appendices include more Bible stories of women in pain as well as an overview of George MacDonald's *The Marquis' Secret* (where the main character Malcolm does an excellent job in engaging the strong emotions of many different women, including piquing the interest of the woman he eventually marries).

The husband who invests the time and energy to appropriately engage his wife's emotions will be tempted to stay in his marriage, as opposed to finding a new woman, losing all of his investment, and starting all over again. Similarly, the wife who has a husband who engages her emotions is not going to be as tempted to look elsewhere, when she is already treated well.

Hackney builds on the tradition of marriage experts like Gary Smalley, John Trent, Willard Harley, and Susan Johnson as well as family systems practitioners like Peter Steinke. He adds his own experience of walking alongside men in troubled marriages to construct a model for relational health. This mixture produces a compelling vision for a long-term, intimate relationship between a man and a woman. He also shares insights and stories from over thirty years of pastoral experience and men's ministry leadership.



THE CHANGE WE NEED



e are in the midst of a horrifying Spiritual
Warfare battle and Satan is winning," Pastor
Daryl Purpera, pastor of First Baptist
Church Central told Inspire Louisianarecently. "People
are dying everyday and according to their obituaries,
everyone is going to heaven. But I'm here to tell you as a
preacher for our most high God, everybody doesn't go to
heaven when they die."

"The most difficult task that any pastor faces is not preaching a sermon in the pulpit but officiating at a funeral where you don't know if the deceased ever had a personal relationship with our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ," Pastor Purpera explained. "If the deceased has never exhibited any attributes of Jesus Christ in their lives, then you can't preach about them going to heaven. All you can do is to tell the congregation about the wonderful life that awaits them when they make Jesus Christ the focus in their life."

"If anyone wants to know what a God-less society looks like, all you have to do is look around you," Pastor Purpera, who started his Christian pastoral journey nearly thirty years ago as an assistant-Youth Pastor noted. "Our society is now influenced from top to bottom by Satanic forces. The forces of evil no longer try to hide their intentions; everything is in plain sight and its a terrible sight."

Daryl Purpera first became interested in youth ministry in the late 1990's. "It seemed that the Youth Groups were always short of adults to help so I volunteered as a Counselor at a Summer Youth Camp. I enjoyed my experience especially seeing the beauty in kids finding out about the joy and happiness available to them in the Christian way of life."

"I noticed that the more I worked in Youth Ministry, the happier I became," Pastor Purpera stated. "I finally decided that I could be more effective in Youth Ministry if I obtained some formal training in the Ministry so I enrolled long-distance at Trinity Bible College in Andersonville, Georgia."

"I was at Greenwell Springs Baptist Church as Assistant Youth Pastor for a number of years, then became Youth Minister there before coming over to First Baptist Church Central as Youth Pastor, then getting promoted to lead pastor," Pastor Purpera said in recalling his journey. "It was while I was an Assistant Youth Minister that I did my first funeral. That was an amazing experience."

"The Youth Minister at the time, knew the deceased but for some reason he had to go out of town the day of the funeral, so he left it in my hands. He did prep me for what was to come. Apparently, both sides of the family hated each other so there was going to be a 10 o'clock service for one side of the family and another at 11 o'clock for the other side of the family."

"I get to the funeral home about 9:15 am hoping to pick up a little information about the deceased whom I had never seen or heard of before," Pastor Purpera recalled. "About 9:30, both sides of the family came into the funeral home. And you can probably guess what happened; they began to fight. I looked at the Funeral Director who told me: 'We'll just let them fight as long as they don't break anything."

"I was fortunate to be raised in a family with a Believing daddy and mother," Pastor Purpera pointed out. "My dad, who is still going strong in his mideighties is one of the most faithful believers that I know. He has been a very good influence in my life."

"In his younger days my dad did a lot of mission work including making trips to Nepal and the Himalayan Mountains. He was always looking for someone to tell them about his Jesus including during the many years he worked in the plants in Baton Rouge area."

Pastor Daryl Purpera has made it a priority in his ministry at First Baptist Church Central to do as much outreach as possible in the community. FBCC holds a Monday morning Bible Study at the Claiborne Retirement Center in the Shoe Creek development on Sullivan. FBCC also has an Honor Program designed to honor local Law Enforcement Officers. In addition, FBCC provides "snack foods" to the local law enforcement officers on a weekly basis.

"We are very active during Easter Week with a drive thru display telling the final days of Jesus' life, and His appointment with the cross," the Pastor of FBCC explained. "We also host a luncheon open to the public during Easter Week."

In a recent outreach Bible Study at MePa's Restaurant in Central on a Tuesday evening, Pastor Purpera was presenting a study on Spiritual Warfare. The particular aspect of Spiritual Warfare under discussion was Angels when Pastor Purpera asked the class: "Has anyone seen an Angel?" No one in the assembled group acknowledged of having actually seen an angel. So, Pastor Purpera related this story.

"I've never seen an angel either but my Mother did. My Mother was extremely sick with Ovarian Cancer and was in a hospital in Natchez at the time. The doctors told us, the family, that they had done all they could and there was no more treatment available and her time was short. We wanted to pray with my Mother but she was very distraught with the news from the doctors, and didn't want us to pray with and for her, so most of us left including my Dad."

"About halfway home, my Dad said: "Turn around, we're going back. The Spirit is telling me to go back and pray," Pastor Purpera recalled the events of that day. "This time we won't ask her permission but will just go in her room and pray as the spirit leads us. So that was what we did with my Dad leading the pray."

"The family went into the room, surrounded her bed, held hands and my Dad said a very fervent touching prayer. When he finished praying, my mother said in a loud forceful voice; "Wow!!"

"Our family then decided to take her home under hospice care to die or so we thought," Pastor Purpera explained. "She lived another ten years. About a year after the prayer in the hospital with my mother, I was talking with my sister about that day and told her that I was still puzzled as to why my mother, in such poor condition roused up and said, 'Wow' in such a forceful voice."

"I guess she never told you but she saw an Angel standing at the foot of the bed. That was why she said such a loud, 'Wow!," Pastor Purpera's sister revealed.

Daryl Purpera was bi-vocational during most of his career in the Ministry as his day job was with the Louisiana Legislative Auditors Office. For more than a dozen years, Purpera was the elected State Legislative Auditor.

"The biggest problem with that job was that no-body that got elected really wanted good government. Newly elected legislators would arrive in Baton Rouge all full of vim and vigor for good government but by their third legislative sessions they were mostly concerned about staying in office. I was glad when I got up enough courage with the good Lord's help to quit."

And the last song mentioned above, "No Matter How Much I Struggle and Strive, I Can't Get Out of This World Alive;" pretty much answers its own question. It begs the question of a "Higher Power." If it was humanly possible, I'm sure that somewhere along the line of the many brilliant people who have populated this globe called earth throughout human history, one or more persons would have figured out how to get out of this world alive and have at least a patent pending on the design. Right? Of Course!

So, why not employ a "Super-Natural Power" as described in the Holy Scriptures? No other book, written document or fable explains how the "Super-Natural Power" works better than the "Holy Scriptures." It's so simple: Believe, Receive and Ask in faith and it shall be granted. A. FOOD GIFT-BOXES

An acknowledgment and appreciative salute to our uniformed Law Enforcement personnel and first Respondents with an on-going expression of "thanks" by providing Law Enforcement personal in the BR Metro Area with food gift-boxes consisting of pre-packaged processed deli-food and baked goods and some specially prepared foods by Church and Ministry groups. This Plan of Action (POA) could include weekly or bi-weekly "special" on-site cooking events featuring such items as Jambalaya, Pastalaya, Gumbos, and burgers and dogs. Currently, one Church group in the Central Area supplies the local Law Enforcement (CPD and EBRSO) with "snack-sacks" on a weekly basis.

B. WEEKLY BIBLE DISTRIBUTION AND DISCUSSION SESSIONS

We all live daily on the Edge of Eternity; however, since Satan is so super active these days, our law enforcement personnel live on the sharp edge never knowing when Satan will attack them through one of his Demons from Hell. Therefore, it would seem the Christian "thing" to do to add a little shield of protection to our law enforcement protective kit by providing them ready access to the most powerful shield ever known to mankind, a Christian Bible.

We think that Weekly Bible Distribution and Discussion Sessions per shift of law enforcement officers at the precinct/district level would be a step in the right direction for added protection. Christian historical literature recounts numerous instances whereby the Bible acted as a shield; stopping a bullet, turning a blade, adding courage at the right moment and enabling a kind word be spoken to tamp down a volatile scenario.

Bibles, perhaps pocket size would be provided to all Law Enforcement Personnel who would like to have added protection when on the Sharp Edge of Eternity. The Distribution/Discussion Sessions would take place in a window of time 20 minutes prior to the start of each shift. An open discussion of the grueling duties of law enforcement in the particular precinct/district level activity could result in the Faith Based Community of each area being able to interact with people in various forms of need.

C. AN INITIAL 90-DAY PRAYER-TIME FLY-OVER OF EBR PARISH

The 90-Day Prayer-Time "Fly-Overs" of EBR Parish would be conducted in small private planes with a two-person Pastor Prayer Team that would be praying for God's mercy on our area to stem the violence the duration of the flight. These flights which would encompass a fly-over of all of EBR Parish each day would continue for 90 consecutive days weather permitting.

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D. ACTIVE CHRISTIAN PRISON MINISTRY

Prison Ministries in general, whether local, statewide, national or international are world-wide Ministries in scope that have achieved great success in changing the direction of offenders' lives and reducing recidivism. Offenders in Angola Prison, La Women's Prison and Dixon Correctional Institution in our area have greatly benefited from the prison Ministry Programs. The success rate of the New Orleans Seminary Ministry is unparalleled in producing the desired results with offenders. An active ongoing Prison Ministry in the EBR Parish Prison would be designed to accommodate the short term sentences or jail time of the offenders.

E. THE STOP THE VIOLENCE PRAYER BLANKET (STVPB)

The Prayer Blanket would work much like a "Prayer-Chain" used in Kairos Prison Ministries. Each Prayer-Blanket would consist of 12-five minutes increments per hour and for a total of 288-5 minute increments per a daily 24/7 time frame. It is anticipated that many of the Prayer-Blanket Prayer Warriors would take multiple time slots. Each individual participating in the STVPB would pray fervently on their knees for five minutes to God the Father through His precious Son, Jesus Christ, as our intercessor that God would intervene in the Baton Rouge area with His awesome grace gifts and dramatically reduce the violence.

F. THE PARTIAL AMNESTY REDEMPTION LEGISLATION (PARL)

The Partial Amnesty Redemption Legislation (PARL) would be developed with specific checks and balances as well as goals and achievements by the offenders to receive the benefits of the PARL. Two of the largest areas of quicksand in Prison Reform are Probation and Parole. The recorded criminal record that follows the Offender after release from actual prison confinement greatly hampers the released offender from gainful employment, and educational opportunities as well as financial well-being.

A great majority of offenders in prison and on parole or probation would desperately like to have a "Re-Set Button" for their lives. This writer can after more than fifteen years involvement in Prison Ministry envision the PARL program being highly successful especially with the younger offenders and middle-aged prisoners who have spent years in confinement. The economic value of the PARL program to the economy of Louisiana and to the annual State Budget would be absolutely overwhelmingly positive.

Under a strict set of guidelines and checks and balances, a qualified offender would accept a certain lower sentence for his/her offense by accepting responsibility for their offenses and becoming a qualified model to re-enter society. First, the offenders taking advantages of the PARL Program would provide an awesome new well trained workforce to businesses in need of specifically trained employees. Secondly, the dramatic reduction in prison population would dramatically reduce state prison expenditures reducing a tax burden for Louisiana Taxpayers.

G. A GODLY SOLUTION:
